Old Testament Survey : Z E C H A R I A H

Author: Zechariah - His name means "Jehovah Remembers"

One of 29 OT men with this name. He is of priestly lineage as the son of Berechiah & grandson of Iddo (cf. Zech. 1:1,7; Ezra 5:1; 6:14; Neh. 12:4,16). Born in Babylon and brought to Jerusalem under Zerubbabel as a "young man" (2:4) and began prophesying in 520 B.C. Matthew 23:35 indicates that he was murdered between the temple and the altar as was a n earlier Zechariah (2 Chron. 24:20-21).

Date: 520-470

Biblical Context: Ezra 5:1-6:15 Contemporary: Haggai

Setting: A younger contemporary of Haggai. The foundation for the new temple was laid in 536 B.C. but the work had never been completed. Haggai got the people started on the rebuilding, and Zechariah encouraged them to continue the work with his first prophecy coming two months after Haggai's. The temple was completed in 516 B.C. Chapters 9-14 were written later with the references to Greece indicating a date between 480-470 B.C.
