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#### Pastors' Annual Report - Year 2015

I will complete 26 years of ministry at Grace Bible Church in April 2017. The 2016 Statistical & Activities Report below highlights my ministry involvement and also chronicles the special guests and church activities that have occurred at GBC in 2016. I would like to highlight a few of these.

First, I must highlight that we had 17 baptisms in 2016. This is the most we have ever had in one year. Eight of those were of people that had been baptized before but more recently recognized that they were not actually believers at the time and wanted to be baptized as genuine disciples of Jesus in personal testimony of their identification with Jesus' death, burial and resurrection. They are new creatures who were crucified with Christ and no longer live, but Christ lives in them (Galatians 2:20). Praise God for His mercy and grace extended to us in Jesus Christ by the power of His Spirit!

It remains an honor and privilege for me to serve the Lord as pastor of Grace Bible Church and to teach and preach God's word. I continued the sermon series on the Life of Chris in examining all four of the Gospel accounts with Luke serving as the chronological outline. We are now up to Luke 11:13. At the start of the year I completed of a short series on the purpose of the church which extended into a short series on worship. I also preached on the following special topics, *The Empty Cross, The Bondage of Sin is Broken, The Wise Woman vs The Foolish Female, Responsibilities of Pastors, Being a Man of God, Ocean Commotion* (VBS Sermon), *Basic Biblical Principles for Making Political Decisions, Hope for Christians* (a post election sermon), *Origin of Christmas Traditions*, and *The Gifts of Christmas.* I also spoke at our regular Holiday services on Good Friday, Resurrection Morning Sunrise Service, Thanksgiving Day, Christmas Eve and New Year's Eve.

Several other men preached for us in 2016. Pastor Zieger preached three times including his farewell sermon on July 10. Three of our Deacons filled the pulpit: Jonathan Harris (March 13), Ed Colón (October 2) and Jack Scalice (October 9). Missionaries Gary & Carol Allen (Christar -Turkey) spoke in Sunday School and gave a short presentation on August 21. Missionary Chris Eisbrenner (Ariel Ministries) spoke at all our services on November 20 including our Harvest Dinner.

I was involved with many other teaching ministries including the Church Discovery Class for Sunday School, Hermeneutics Class, Theology Class, Special services, a few College and Career Bible studies, counseling, pre-marital, preaching at Elant, Vacation Bible School, and nine seminars. The Seminars included three at the church related to parenting, five on prayer for a weekend retreat, and one at the NY IFCA Regional for which I serve as President.

Our Sunday Evening ministry consists of missions meetings on the second Sunday of each month and special events. These included the *Spring Sing Thing* and *Fall Festival of Praise* as ways to encourage people to use their musical talents regardless of skill level to praise the Lord.

Diane and I were not able to host the Old Fashioned Ice Cream Social as we usually do. However, we were hosts at the weddings of our sons to which the whole church was invited. Jonathan and Danielle were married May 21 and David and Natasha were married July 9. It was a special honor to be able to officiate both weddings. Work at the parsonage and Diane's back and hip problems precluded hosting our annual Open House after the Christmas Eve service, and we are very grateful to Jessie Scalice, Teresa Garcia and Odette Mendoza for hosting a wonderful fellowship at church to replace it.

Our congregation was blessed with many babies in 2016, so there were multiple baby showers and dedication ceremonies. In addition to my sons getting married, Ed & Melanie Colón's daughter, Rebekah married Beau Mancini on July 29, so there were also multiple events related to those weddings. Performing weddings for those I have watched grow up from being infants indicates that I and my contemporaries are in a new stage of life.

There were many other church activities in 2106 which are listed in the Statistical Report and detailed in ministry reports that follow. Some were annual events and others were one time events. GBC is a very active congregation.

I am involved with many things that extended ministry to those outside our regular ministries. This includes speaking at or attending meetings of other organizations such as college groups, church retreats and church or pastors' associations. We continue to provide worship services at Elant for two months of the year, and I have tried to attend our town Supervisor's meetings for religious leaders. I have been involved in our church association by writing an article for VOICE, our fellowship's magazine, and continuing to serve as our Regional's President which includes running its annual conference. The ministry of GBC also extends outside our church through email, facebook, our website and Sermon Audio. My Sermon Notes are posted each week and about 590 people receive them directly via email. (See the separate report on the statistics of our internet ministries).

Attendance fluctuated throughout the year, and sometimes radically from week to week (187 on June 19 and then 110 the following Sunday). Our averages by quarter were 1<sup>st</sup> - 150, 2<sup>nd</sup> - 139, 3<sup>rd</sup> - 135 and 4<sup>th</sup> - 137 with an average for the year of 140. We began the year with 67 active and 3 inactive members and ended the year with 64 active and 9 inactive members. We added 9 members and removed 8 members (three moved away, three are attending other local churches and two were disciplined).

Average giving per quarter was nearly at or above budget throughout the year yielding a net gain of about \$16,000. In addition to the regular giving of \$227,678.62, there was \$15,568.90 in designated giving for a total of \$243,337.52. Our congregation has been very generous and compassionate.

Our current financial health will enable us to pursue several construction projects in 2017. We want to move forward in extending the foyer and adding a portico to the front of the church, replace the current truck-port with an enclosed garage and make the existing Truck-Port a pavilion with a children's play area next to it. However, though we thought the completion of the parking lot project would finally resolve our issues with the Town, it appears we will have to hire the engineers to come back so that another amended site plan can be filed. Pray we can get this all resolved as soon as possible.

On a personal note, Diane and I praise the Lord for the personal thoughtfulness that is extended to us in so many different ways. We are grateful for the thoughtful gifts we have received and were overwhelmed the generosity of everyone in raising funds for us to go to Israel. I am planning to be there May 15-June 4 for a study tour with Master's Seminary. Diane's back problems preclude her from going on something so physically demanding, but we are looking into other things she can do that would be special for her. We are also very grateful for the help we have received. Many things would have been left undone without it. The therapeutic hot tup spa continues to be a tremendous help in relieving Diane's chronic back pain (and that of many others too - I am the only one in the family with a good back).

The purpose of Grace Bible Church remains the same. We want to be as effective as possible in fulfilling our purpose of *Glorifying God by Making Disciples of the Lord Jesus Christ*. Every ministry of the church should reflect that purpose and fulfill one or more of our four goals: \*Communicate New Life in Christ Through Evangelism; \*Cultivate New Life in Christ Through Edification; \*Care for New Life in Christ Through Fellowship and \*Celebrate New Life in Christ Through Worship. It continues to be my vision that this church reaches our community and then beyond through church planting and missions.

An additional measure we want to take this year toward those goals is hiring some help to figure out and complete several projects that will help with our outreach and usage of our facilities. We are also considering hiring Dominic Bonasio part time as an Associate Minister of Evangelism, Assimilation and Visitation. We have to wait until his disability retirement is settled before we will know the finances required and his availability, but we do want pursue it if possible.

I want to conclude with giving praise to the Lord for the many faithful servants He has brought here to serve Him at Grace Bible Church. I am grateful for the time Pastor Zieger was with us. It was sad to have him and Michelle give their farewell in July. Living in close proximity to their children has been helpful. They are still looking for a church home in PA, but it appears an opportunity for him to preach / teach may be opening very soon. It is a joy to serve with those on the Pastor's Advisory Council and / or as Deacons including John Halpin, Dominic Bonasio, Ed Colón (Chair), Jonathan Harris, Phil Jordan,

Randy Ryan, Jack Scalice and Doug Welch. Jim Phelan has worked with us a Deacon intern and will be ready for affirmation by the congregation by Spring. The ladies on our Women's Servant Council (WSC) that have faithful served us are Melanie Colón (Chair), Sandy Garcia, Mary Gellatly (Emeritus), Nancy Halpin, Diane Harris, Luann Nappi and Linda Walter. Jandry Bernal has completed her internship with the WSC and will be presented to the congregation for affirmation at the Annual Meeting. We have been well served by our Treasurer, Jane Scaramuzzo, and our Church Clerk, Sandy Garcia. Dominic Bonasio served as the Chairman of our Evangelism Committee. Jonathan Harris served as our Music Director. Jimmy Ryan served as our AWANA commander through Spring and Dominic Bonasio is director of Kids4Truth which began in the Fall. Andrea Phelan has directed our High School Girls ministry. Melanie Colón was our Vacation Bible School Director and ran G.I.R.L. Time. Many others are listed in the Christian Education report and the Music Ministry report. God has blessed this church with many servants of the Lord that are not listed by name. The vast majority of adults and teens at GBC have served in some particular ministry in 2016, and every ministry has contributed to the building up the whole body.

May each of us continue to faithfully serve our Lord Jesus Christ in 2017 with many more joining so that we might reach our community and beyond with the gospel of the Lord Jesus Christ and help one another become mature in Him.

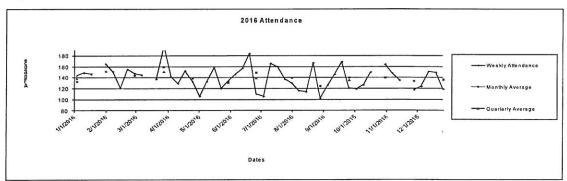

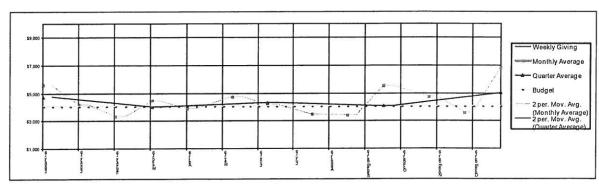

Project plans for 2017 include: \*The computers for the sound board and video display are currently being replaced. \*Finalize site plan with the town. \*Purchase of children's outdoor play equipment and installation on south side of current truck port. \*Convert current truck port into a pavilion. \*Build a garage for the snow plow and storage. \*Enlarge foyer and install a portico in front of church replacing existing porch. \*Replace church furnace. \*Change existing sign with a programmable electronic one. \*Rebuild and re-roof front of parsonage.

#### Missions Report - 2016

Those who are interested in our Missionaries and Missions in general meet on the second Sunday evening of each month for updates about our missionaries and to pray for them. This includes both those we financially support and those who are friends of Grace Bible Church. If you have an interest in missions, please come out to our meetings to get involved.

Morris Kushmar had kept our Missions bulletin boards up to date. Letters from both supported missionaries and missionary friends are posted around the World Map in the back of the church. The prayer cards for our missionaries are located under the map. Missionary letters received by email are forwarded to all those who would like them. Our VBS Missions project collected \$777.02 which was added to the fund collected from the congregation in general for a total of \$1,131.90 given to World Mission for their *Treasure* ministry. This provides a solar powered, digital "talking Bible" in the language of the targeted unreached people group of oral learners. Dominican Republic Missions Project - Winton & Jandry Bernal have headed up this ministry. They are helping two churches with discipleship and led a team to help with ministry at *Centro Tecnico Vocacional Aleluya*. The team from GBC in 2106 year consisted of the Bernal family, Andrea Phelan, Luke Solomon, Chloe Solomon and Nina Scalice. They conducted a VBS type program for several hundred children. An additional \$2,062 was raised to augment the \$3,000 budgeted with \$5,010.95 spent on shipping collected items, supplies, transportation and food. They will be returning in 2017. No Supported Missionary was with us in 2016. We did have the following missionaries visit:

\*Gary & Carol Allen (*Christar - Turkey*) reported on August 21 about their ministry in Istanbul primarily among immigrants and refugees. This is the work God has placed on their hearts since retirement. Despite the current turmoil in Turkey, they plan to return in early 2017

\*Chris Eisbrenner (Ariel Ministries - Teaching at their Bible Institute) was with us November 20. He spoke in Sunday School, the morning worship service and our harvest dinner covering the ministry of Ariel and his responsibilities with them, Messiah in the Tabernacle, Messiah in the Old Testament and The Jewish Perspective of Church.

Ricky & Laura Beck (*Harvest Bible Chapel - Buffalo*) have been able to relocate to Buffalo (but continue to pray for the sale of their house in Randolph). They have prepared for a long time and have set the date for kick-off of the church for February 5, 2017. Pray for them and this fledgling church in Buffalo. Dave Leak - *The Master's Harvest* evangelism at Fairs & Festivals throughout the Northeast. This ministry has expanded since last year spending 50 days at Fairs and personally talking with 2795 people. Out of the surplus of the 2016 budget, we would like to send Dave \$4,237.00 for reimbursement for his 2016 ministry expenses (travel, fair fees, camping costs). Four of our missionaries families are now retired (Cooley, Coyle, Knauss & Motely). In the next few years as funds become available we would like to increase our involvement with active missionaries, and especially those serving in other cultures or foreign fields as possible.

### Men's Discipleship Report - 2016

In Matthew 28:19-20, Jesus gives the Great Commission - "Go therefore and make disciples of all the nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and the Son and the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I commanded you; and lo, I am with you always, even to the end of the age." The command is to make disciples and it is accomplished in three stages: 1) Going - Evangelism, which is proclaiming the gospel. 2) Baptizing - Identification, which is bringing a growing belief about Jesus into a public profession of faith. 3) Teaching them to observe His commandments - Practical spiritual growth, which is helping a Christian know, understand and walk properly with the Lord.

Discipleship is a core ministry at Grace Bible Church which occurs on many levels and is focused on the third aspect of the Great Commission. Our "teaching" ministry occurs in large groups such as Sunday Morning Worship, small groups such as our Bible Studies, and individually both formally and informally. Most individual discipleship occurs informally as Christians talk, pray and fellowship with each other, but we also have a formal *One-to-One Discipleship* program which is designed to accelerate Christian growth and train Christians to replicate themselves in others.

We had several men involved in this in 2016, but with increase in new people attending GBC, there is a greater need for this ministry too. Please see Ed Colòn (632-6460) if you are interested in being discipled by a more mature Christian.

## 2016 Women's Discipleship Report

This year we have continued to promote discipleship among the women. Ten more women were discipled, and we have 10-12 women currently being discipled, with an average of about 50% of the women at church having gone through this great growing experience. With so many new people and those moving away, there are many people discipling and serving the Lord in churches all over the country!

For those unfamiliar with discipleship, it is not a program of a class. It is a relationship formed between a more mature Christian and a younger Christian to cause growth to them both. Our favorite tool to use is the "One-to-One Discipleship" work book which has 11 lessons on basic Christian living. The disciple gains head and heart knowledge of God as they learn the Scriptures and how to walk with the Lord. The mentor helps the disciple understand the lessons and their application to the various situations of life. Biblical principles and commands address every question that could come up. The pattern was set by Christ as He discipled 12 men, who later spread the gospel throughout the world. It is a pleasure to see women grow. ## **Evangelism Committee Report 2016**

2016 has been another busy year for us, praise God! Many people helped out over the course of the year, including those who witnessed on their own with friends, family, co-workers, strangers and at various locations.

In God's sovereignty, once again we were able to evangelize at many different locations and events such as, but not limited to, the streets of New Paltz, the Walkway Over The Hudson, the Ulster County Fair, East Fishkill Day, Wappinger Town Day, St Patrick's Day Parade in Wappingers Falls, 4th of July Parade in Hyde Park, city of Poughkeepsie, CareNet, the Dominican Republic, Washington D.C., and Huntington Beach Pier, CA.

To start the year off, we held a Way of the Master Evangelism Crash Course in which we were able to equip people to share the gospel for the upcoming St. Patrick's Day parade in Wappingers Falls and the 4th of July parade in Hyde Park. Once the weather became warmer, we returned to the Walkway Over The Hudson. In the fall we headed to the city of Poughkeepsie, evangelizing in the areas of Market and Main Street. We were able to pass out Gospel tracts, bibles, dvds and shared the Gospel with people one to one at the above locations.

In June, several of us traveled to Washington, D.C. to help evangelist Ray Comfort evangelize at the largest atheist gathering, the "Reason Rally." Meeting up with many other laborers from around the country, we were able to hand out tracts, dvds, cds, books and share the Gospel one to one with many people.

This year we were asked by Carol Martin to take over sponsoring and operating the "ARE YOU A GOOD PERSON" booth at the Ulster County Fair, which lasts 6 days. Many people came out to help again! Brother Dave Leak and his daughter's Bethany and Rebecca came down from New Hampshire to help every day. The Gospel was shared one to one with around 600 hundred people! God willing, GBC will continue hosting this event for the future. Our future goal is the Dutchess County fair as well.

In September we once again operated booths at both the East Fishkill and Wappinger Town Days. We changed the theme of the booths to an "INTELLIGENCE TEST" booth with a great turnout! We were able to share the gospel one to one with many people.

We also conducted a Halloween outreach at several people's homes where Gospel tracts and dvds were given out to people who came to the door. This is a great way to evangelize and give the gospel to people who come to your door.

We will continue our efforts in 2017 to spread the Gospel to this lost and dying world. We will continue going to many of our regular locations and desire to spend more time at local colleges, more local streets and public venues, trips to NYC, teaching more evangelism courses and helping Dave Leak with his evangelism ministry at fairs throughout the North East.

#### 2016 Website Report

The mundane aspects of keeping the website updated has fallen to me. I greatly appreciate the help of Jim Phelan when it comes to anything about it beyond very simple. Christine Bidetti also helped with a problem we encountered earlier in the year.

I do not have any statistics from the website since I could not find a plugin that was keeping track of it. I installed one today (1/12/2017), so I will be able to report on this in the future. I can only guess at possible traffic. There was an 16% increase in 2015 to 127,415 visitors. If we had a similar increase in 2016 we would have had at least 148,000 visitors. That is not unreasonable since there was a 35% increase in the number of people receiving my written *Sermon Notes* directly (from 436 to 590). I would also reasonably guess that we also continue to receive visits to the website from anywhere in the world there is someone who reads English - and perhaps in some places lacking even that since the website has an automatic translator available.

I did retrieve some statistics from our SermonAudio account. While I did not figure out how to track visits to our pages, their reports sent to us listed 2,163 MP3 audio sermon downloads (37% were to mobile devices) and 34 video downloads (we only have 2 videos posted).

SermonAudio also reported the locations from which downloads were made for a total of 47 different countries. As would be expected, by far the most was from various places in the United States (63%). Second to that was Germany (13%), then the United Kingdom (5%) and Spain (3.4%). There were downloads to all major English speaking nations as expected, but it was surprising for China (1.2%) to rank higher than some of them and most of the European nations. Kuwait (0.5%) was surprisingly high and it is significant that other Muslim nations including United Arab Emirates, Qatar, and Bahrain are represented. The GBC ministry via internet is a very significant part of the ministry of Grace Bible Church locally, nationally and internationally.

It is also worth noting that 6 of the 10 top downloads on Sermon Audio are of the videos of Jonathan Harris' debates and then his sermons and apologetics classes. My most downloaded sermons were on Marriage & Divorce and *Jesus, The Model Servant*. I know from the number of powerpoint requests that my Mothers' Day and Father's Day sermons get a lot of views as do a couple of sermons in the Daniel series and the Colossians series. We are switching the access to the powerpoint files to a direct download from the website instead of having to request them from me via email.

We praise the Lord for allowing us to have such significant direct ministry to people far beyond our geographical limitations. All praise and glory to our gracious God!

#### Music Director Annual Report for 2016

The year started off with the need for at least one new music leader as the music ministry at GBC adapted to not having a regular pianist to play on a monthly basis. Kefa Olang became that leader early in the year, and gradually became a monthly praise team leader by the end of the year. Jimmy Ryan also continues to serve as a faithful praise team leader. Melissa Detulio has continued to take on a musical leadership role once a month as a praise team coordinator. The remaining fourth and/or fifth Sundays of any given month are filled by Jonathan Harris and his team or Nina Scalice playing hymns on piano as Pastor Harris leads.

One of the major changes taking place in 2016 was the addition of a number of musicians and singers, some performing regularly, and some on a when possible or an as needed basis. Many of the praise teams switch off who is playing or singing on any given Sunday at the discretion of the leader/coordinator according to a number of factors including but not limited to availability, ability, and style. It is a great blessing to have a diversity of musical instruments and voices represented.

Philip Jordan continues to oversea the sound system. He has trained up additional help this year, especially with regard to Jeff Lowery, who will often fill in when Philip isn't able to attend.

On a spiritual level, the music ministry seems to be in a very good position compared with previous years. There are no known rivalries, jealousies, or dissensions known to the music director. There does exist a spirit of team work and often times a sensitivity to the Spirit's leading during the worship services.

The music director's hope is that in 2017 he will have more participation in "special music," and will be able to raise up one additional praise team leader as well as a future music director to serve in his absence while he is away at school. One additional area Philip Jordan and Jonathan Harris will be working on improving are the *powerpoint* presentations. Philip will be working on the technical end of things (where the projector will hang, where an operator will sit), while Jonathan Harris will work on a system for improving the quality of the presentations.

#### College Career Annual Report 2016

The College Career group has maintained its level of participation from 2015 averaging anywhere from 10 to 25 young people on any given evening. There are a few new faces as previous regular attendees have moved on to other activities including marriage and home life and/or other ministries. The year started off with a continuation of a study in the Gospel of Luke in which many of the young men rotated leading a lesson on Saturday nights. Starting in the Fall, the group started a study of "Total Truth," with Jonathan Harris leading. A rotation of young men lead additional devotionals to supplement the study. There is nothing currently planned for 2017 except to continue the regular meetings.

#### Kids4Truth Annual Report 2016

Starting in October of 2016, GBC switched from Awana to Kids4Truth Clubs for our children's ministry for grades preK to 6th grade. We started off with about 34 kids and 17 volunteers eager to share God's Truth with the children.

Kids4Truth Clubs is a "systematic theology for kids that teaches Bible doctrine." It helps to fulfill the mission of glorifying "God by providing church educational resources that are true to God's Word and encourage maturity in Christ."

The goals of Kids4Truth are:

- 1-Effectively teach important truths about God to boys and girls through meaningful, motivational, and memorable learning experiences.
- 2-Define and refine the minimum standard of Christian knowledge that boys and girls ought to have in order to avoid confusion, discourage hypocrisy, and promote authentic faith.
- 3-Utilize a tried-and-true, effective method by which we fortify young hearts and minds with doctrine.
- 4-Motivate and equip local churches, families, and individuals to become effective communicators of Biblical truth to children. "We want boys and girls to know both what they believe and why they believe it."

Kids are separated into 4 grade levels. Pre-kindergarten to kindergarten, 1st & 2nd, 3rd & 4th, and 5th & 6th. We start off the evening at 6:30pm with opening prayer, pledge of allegiance, and music. Then the prek-k and 1-2 grades are dismissed downstairs for games, snacks, counsel time and crafts. The two older grade levels, 3-4 and 5-6, stay upstairs for their counsel time and then are dismissed for their game time. All grade levels then separate to their respective class rooms for Scripture memorization and bible lessons from their workbooks.

Kids4Truth is on Friday nights from 6:30pm to 8:30pm from October to May. Kids receive awards, patches, and prizes for Scripture memorization, completing weekly workbook lessons, attendance, etc. We plan on having several theme nights throughout the year, musical presentations through singing, and a year end celebration that we are currently planning. We believe Kids4Truth will help fulfill GBC's mission statement of "Glorifying God By Making Disciples Of The Lord Jesus Christ." Please keep this ministry in prayer. Thank you Saints!

## Revised 1/28/17 Treasurer's Report - Grace Bible Church - for the 2016 Fiscal Year

#### Overview

Praise the Lord for His abundant grace in 2016. Regular giving fluctuates from week to week and month to month, but was nearly at or above budget each quarter ending the year \$16,082.82 (7.6%) above anticipated budgeted General income. General Fund Expenses were \$14,111.61 below budget for a total net gain of \$30,194.26. Total designated income (not transferred from General Fund) was \$15,658.90 and total designated expenditures was \$13,263.86.

#### Regular Giving

General Giving varied from week to week from a low of \$1,155.00 (6/19) to a high of \$8,301.66 (12/15). The first quarter was 0.7% under budget, rose to 6.35% over budget in the second quarter, dropped to 0.81% over budget in the third quarter, and finished the fourth quarter 23.94% above budget. Total regular giving was \$227,678.62 which is \$16,082.82 (7.76%) above budgeted giving

#### General Expenses

Spending for general expenses was below budget by 2.3% (\$1,128.09). The few line items with excess expenditures were offset by funds not spent in other line items.

#### **Local Missions**

Local Missions was under budget by 10.6% (\$1,703.50). Most line items were near or well below budget. Start up costs for Kids4Truth more than doubled the line item for AWANA / Kids4Truth

#### Missionaries & Missions Organizations

Missionaries and Mission Organizations were at or near budget in all categories.

#### **Staff Compensation**

The Pastor's health plan remains flat due to the change to Christian Healthshare Ministries. The Ministry Assistant was not able to take full advantage of the hours offered to him. Pastor Zieger ceased employment July 10, 2016

#### Capital Fund

The Capital Fund began the year with a balance of \$26,740.36 and ended with a balance of \$17,079.97. The major projects were improving the parking lot (\$14,971.32), adding the light at the driveway entrance (\$1,278.47) and rebuilding the Parsonage bathroom (\$4,719.09). (See Fund Report for details).

#### **Designated Funds**

The generosity of people above and beyond regular giving resulted in an additional income of \$15,658.90 for benevolence, missions and project funds. \$10,618.70 was expended with a total of \$13,228.01 remaining as designated for future use. (See Fund Report for details).

#### 2016 Budget Proposal Notes

#### Overview:

The proposed regular budget for 2017 is \$ 217,672.00 This is a spending increase of \$6,076.00 (2.87 %) from the 2016 amended budget. The giving amount needed to meet budget will be \$4,186.00 per week or \$18,139.33 per month. Projections for regular income in 2017 is between \$216,000 and \$226,000.00

Comments will be made on line items with significant changes or that need explanation of their purpose.

#### **General Expenses**

Capital Fund: Sent to designated fund to cover costs of major repairs, replacement and capital projects *Electric*: Lights are a major expense for the church and the bill has dropped due to the switch to LED lights.

Light expenses are a smaller percentage of parsonage costs, so there was not significant cost reduction.

Fellowship Activities: Expenses for Church Picnic, Annual Harvest Dinner and fellowships.

Kitchen: Plates, cups, utensils, coffee, etc. Costs overlap greatly with Fellowship Activities

Leadership Training: Registration costs for church leaders to attend conferences and leadership materials Maintenance: Reflects cost for maintaining property and facilities. Includes cleaning, repairs and supplies Music & Worship: Copyright licenses, music, equipment repair & replacement, bulletins and communion

Office Expense: Supplies and postage

Security: Costs for training, yearly qualification and equipment

#### **Outreach/Missions Expenses**

*Kids4Truth.* More children are attending with the change from AWANA to Kids4Truth. Donations & fees for of those using this ministry keep the ministry costs down for the church.

Christian Education: Sunday School materials and educational supplies for all CE programs

Local Outreach: Special Events - Costs of community outreaches - town days, fairs, etc. We are now running the Ulster County Fair outreach instead of just assisting another ministry.

Tea with the King attendance at this ministry has grown and with it with the costs incurred.

VBS. Increased to help with costs of producing the backdrops we get from another church.

Visiting Ministries. Set to reflect anticipated cost

Website: Set to reflect actual cost of ISP service, web site hosting and Sermon Audio fees

#### Missionaries & Missions Organizations:

The USA inflation rate for 2016 was 1.7%. Missionaries and organizations increased and rounded to nearest amount divisible by 12. A strong U.S. dollar meant that no adjustments were needed for exchange and inflation rate for our overseas missionaries.

#### Compensation

The Ministry Assistant and Associate Pastor lines are merged to form a Ministry / Office Assistant line item. Volunteers are wonderful, but there are several outstanding projects that need to be figured out and completed. Funds will be used to hire help for specific projects. These projects require temporary 1099 employees that can figure out and complete the project without assistance from the Pastor. Pay rates will be variable based on skills, education level and experience. This line time would also be used to continue to fund help from David Harris as a licensed minister.

Consideration is being given to license Dominic Bonasio to work part time as Associate Minister of Evangelism, Assimilation and Visitation. When the details of this are figured out, they will be presented to the congregation for consideration and affirmation along with a specific line item for him.

The Senior Pastor's salary was raised 2% with appropriate adjustment to FICA reimbursement.

The Senior Pastor's Medical package will remain the same. (The HRA account accumulates from year to year, but remains with the church when the individual's employment ceases).

#### CAPITAL FUND PROJECTS - 2017

These are listed in the order of priority (not necessarily the order of completion)

- 1) Parking Lot Expansion. \$1,250 was already paid for the As Built Survey. However, we are still having trouble meeting town requirements. We will be incurring additional engineering fees and town assessments. Amounts are currently unknown. We will need to add barriers to keep cars from going into the retention pond and more permanent fencing.
- 2) Electronic Sign to fit within existing sign or similar sized replacement.

Details are to be worked out. At minimum it would have a double sided programable message area. It would be either similar to the sign at RCK High School or the New Hackensack Fire House. Initial research indicate costs will be in the \$8,000 - \$16,000 range.

#### 3) Furnace

It has been recommended by our serviceman that we replace the church furnace in the near future. We are in the beginning stages of this project. We would like to have this project done in Summer when furnace and installation prices are lower.

4) Children's Play Equipment & Fencing

We would like to build a play area on the southeast side of the current truck port. Dominic Bonasio and Jack Scalice have formed a sub-committee for this project. We would like to have this project completed by mid-Spring. We are guessing this will be in the \$3,000 - \$5,000 range including fencing.

5) Pavilion and Garage

This involves making the existing Truck Port a Pavilion by removing the back and sides and refinishing its concrete floor. A garage would be built for storage of the snow plow. We would like the pavilion part of the project to be completed by early Summer before VBS and the garage part completed by the end of Summer.

Cost for refinishing Pavilion floor Initial research on cost of a simple Garage range is \$5,000 - \$8,000

- 6) Front Church Expansion Expand foyer / replace porch, add Portico
  No research has been done yet on costs for this project. We would like it completed before next Winter.
  Initial costs will include architect and engineering fees before building estimates can be made.
- 8) Expansion of building for additional seating.No research has been done yet on costs for this project.Initial costs will include architect and engineering fees before building estimates can be made.

As of January 1, 2017, there was at least \$106,000 in the general fund. We are requesting that \$75,000 of this be moved into the Capital Fund for use on these projects.

#### **Church Leader Affirmation**

# Hispanic Ministry

#### 2016 Report

- Started Spanish Bible study at Sunday school. We studied the following books: Philippians, Colossians and started 1 Thessalonians.
- Continue to translate the Sunday's service into Spanish when it is needed.
- Joint the evangelism team at the 2016 Wappinger's St Patrick day parade.
- Distributed tracts in Main Street, Poughkeepsie.
- Mission trip to The Dominican Republic.

The mission team ministered to about 300 kids at the Compassion Children's center, age between 3-19 years old. The material we taught was Noah's ark (power point translation from Pastor Harris). Eight members of GBC and one person from a Christian church in Poughkeepsie participated in this mission trip. 10 boxes were shipped. We gave clothes, shoes, bibles, backpacks, toys and school supplies to the children and staff. The team visited the burnt unit at the Children's hospital in Santiago; we also gave tracts and stuffed animals to children.

We had the opportunity to minister and pray for some of the children and mothers. We visited and preached at a 2 year old church. We are praying that long term we can continue to build a good rapport with local churches and establish discipleships programs with them. We brought ten copies of the discipleship training, One to One, that we use at church and the feedback from the people that are finishing the program is very good. A Christian marriage workshop was given at another local church.
