Pastors' Annual Report - Year 2018

I will complete 28 years of ministry here in April 2019. The 2018 Statistical & Activities Report below highlights my ministry involvement and also chronicles the special guests and church activities that have occurred at GBC in 2018.

I continue to count it an honor and privilege to serve the Lord as pastor of Grace Bible Church and to teach and preach God's word. I continued the *Life of Christ* sermon series in examining all four Gospel accounts. I began this series in 2013 and will conclude in Fall 2019. I only had a few special topic sermons in 2018 plus our regular Holiday services on Good Friday, Resurrection Morning Sunrise Service, Thanksgiving Day, Christmas Eve and New Year's Eve.

We had a nine guest preachers this year including four missionaries. Ryan Perry (2/11) BMW, Canada. Aleksandr Zakarov (6/24) Director of Russian Christian Radio. Tom Stiles (8/19) Arise! Ministries, and Gary Allen (7/22) Christar, Turkey. The other five speakers were men from GBC: Ed Colón (3/11), Jim Phelan (3/18), Phil Jordan (5/6), David Harris (5/13) and Jonathan Harris (7/1).

Other teaching ministries in which I was involved included: the Church Discovery Classes for Sunday School, Biblical Counseling Classes, Old Testament Survey Classes, a C&C Bible study, Sapphire Nursing Facility for 2 ½ months, VBS, two different pastor's fellowships and three seminars. There was also many counseling sessions and many opportunities for informal teaching.

A very special opportunity was a trip to the Dominican Republic with Winston Bernal who translated and co-taught at 9 seminar sessions and 4 meetings with church leaders in two different church associations. The hand of the Lord was very clearly evident there, perhaps best illustrated by the Sunday I preached at what turned out to the an Assembly of God church on 1 Corinthians 12-14, and not only was the sermon well received though in theological contradiction to AOG doctrine, but the pastor joyfully accompanied us to our next meeting. We were also impressed that after putting down the microphones to preach the sermon, they were not picked up afterward to close the service. That nearly qualifies as a miracle in that culture that likes things very loud.

Diane and I were glad to able to host our annual Old Fashioned Ice Cream Social and the Christmas Eve Open House. It is a small way for us to say thank you to the church congregation for their support of us throughout the year, as well an opportunity for fellowship and people being able to see the parsonage.

We have an active congregation with many special opportunities for fellowship. The monthly men's lunches focusing on aspects of being a godly man have been well attended and helpful. The ladies have had quarterly fellowships, and there have been several all church fellowships throughout the year. Their purpose is to foster closer relationships so that each person's spiritual gifts may be used in building up the whole body of Christ.

There was much joy over the two couples within the church that got married in 2018. There was much sadness over the two funerals for those that were part of our congregation. Ed Conners had been sick off and on for a few months, but we were still surprised by his sudden death. The accidental death of Kenny Steier was a shock to us all. He is a young man that is greatly missed by all, and especially those of us privileged to have had a close personal relationships with him. We have purchased and planted a memorial tree for him by the playground area. We will dedicate the tree in the Spring when it blooms in early May. We are grateful for the Lord's promises that assure us we will see again those who have gone before us.

I was involved with several things that extended ministry to those outside our own congregation. We provided worship services at Sapphire Nursing Facility for two and half months in 2018. I remain actively involved in a local pastors' fellowship and in our church association (IFCA International) serving as our Regional President which includes running its annual conference. The ministry of GBC also extends outside our local church through email, facebook, our website and Sermon Audio. My Sermon Notes are posted each week and over 1,000 people receive them directly via email. (See the separate report on the statistics of our internet ministries). Related to this I spent quite a bit of time trying to find

alternative ways of sending out the emails so they can be sent out in one batch instead of multiple small batches over an 9 hour period due to restrictions by our host server. After the first alternative proved to be too difficult, I have started using MailChimp to send the emails out in bulk. Transferring everything to the new system should be completed by the end of January.

Our plans to renew a ministry to strengthen men bore good fruit in 2018. While unable to do everything we had desired, we did have two very successful men's Bible studies and the monthly Men's Fellowship lunch has been a great encouragement. One-to-One discipleship among the men has also increased greatly. We want to equip men to stand firm in knowing and pleasing God despite the disdain they will receive from an increasingly hostile society that kowtows to feminist thought. Some families have been blessed as the husband/ father does better at fulfilling his God given responsibilities. Tragically, there has also been backlash as some selfish and self-deceived women have preferred destroying their own families than have their husbands walk with God. We are committed to encouraging and supporting men and their families that put God first and warning those that do not that the path they are following only leads to turmoil and tragedy.

Attendance fluctuated throughout the year, and sometimes radically from week to week (as much as 33%). I remain concerned since there was a 13% drop at the end of last year and average attendance remained flat despite our very active weekly evangelism and new people coming. Sunday School also remains very low with our children's classes being combined together. Only three families with children attend on any regular basis. We began the year with 66 active members and 3 inactive members and ended the year with 65 active and 5 inactive members. Five members were removed. 1 moved. 2 are going to other churches. 1 died and 1 was disciplined.

Average giving per quarter remained significantly low throughout the year ending 12.22% under budget (\$27,457.88). By not making some expenditures the net loss was kept to under \$12,000, but this will require a budget reduction for 2019 (See the Treasurer's & Financial Reports).

A point of frustration in 2018 was the site plan required by the town. Not only did it take more than a year to get the approval, but it wasted more than half the funds that were in our Capital Fund. Much time and more finances were also wasted building a very excessive berm, installing unnecessary lights and using fencing that is less safe than what had been up previously. I spent 16 full days and 14 half days on these projects plus additional days spent by Mauro Alverez, Jim Phelan, Ed Colon and others. At least those projects are now done and we have ordered a garage to be built in Spring 2019. This will allow space for the proper storage of our snow plow since the previous building is now a picnic pavilion.

On a very positive side, the children's play area is beautiful and has been a blessing to our children. It has been nice to see the children playing there, and even some families staying after services to share lunch with each other while their children played together.

On a personal note, Diane and I praise the Lord for sustaining us in 2018. He continues to meet our needs abundantly even when facing difficulty. Diane was finally able to get a diagnosis and treatment plan for a chronic foot problem and has surgery scheduled for January 23 with a multiple month recovery to follow. We have already seen the Lord provide in advance both financially through a program at the hospital where she will have the surgery, and practically through the many that have already volunteered to help us out. It is a great blessing to be part of the family of God and see people help one another.

The purpose of Grace Bible Church remains the same. We want to be as effective as possible in fulfilling our purpose of *Glorifying God by Making Disciples of the Lord Jesus Christ*. Every ministry of the church should reflect that purpose and fulfill one or more of our four goals: *Communicate New Life in Christ Through Evangelism; *Cultivate New Life in Christ Through Edification; *Care for New Life in Christ Through Fellowship and *Celebrate New Life in Christ Through Worship. It continues to be my vision that this church reaches our community and then beyond through church planting and missions.

I want to conclude with giving praise to the Lord for the many faithful servants here at Grace Bible Church. Some of them are specifically named in the reports that follow, and many others minister behind

the scene known only to the Lord and those blessed by them. I am especially blessed personally by those serving on the Pastor's Advisory Council, as Deacons, in our Women's Servant Council and ministry leaders.

May each of us continue to faithfully serve our Lord Jesus Christ in 2019 with many more joining so that we might reach our community and beyond with the gospel of the Lord Jesus Christ and help one another become mature in Him.



Deacon Report - 2018

A Deacon is essentially a helper to the elders and a servant of the church. At GBC, this is fulfilled by supervising financial operations within the church, caring and maintaining church property, developing the annual expense budget and assisting the elder(s) as needed. The men accomplishing this at GBC are, Dominic Bonasio, Ed Colón, Phil Jordan, Jim Phelan and Jack Scalice. It is a great privilege to serve with these men, all of whom have demonstrated great humility and dedication to the Kingdom of Christ. Most also serve and assist in other ministries (teaching, preaching, evangelism, discipleship, etc.), which is further testimony of their heart for service. Often, their service goes unseen as they quietly help to meet various needs among the rest of the sheep. There are also two young men, Jeff Lowery & David Harris, who have demonstrated the same heart, have been nominated for the position and have started the mentoring process. I praise God for this group of men and am honored to serve next to them.

A significant effort is made to maintain the buildings and the property surrounding them. Most of that is performed during church wide work days, which are normally conducted twice a year. In 2018 there were 4 work days conducted which testifies to the amount of work conducted during the year. In addition to routine maintenance, repairs and improvements to our surveillance system, the following projects were completed.

- Purchase and installation of children's swing/play set with surrounding fence
- Installation of a security fence surrounding retention pond
- Installation of security lighting in rear parking lot
- Painting of sanctuary and foyer
- Installation of a berm around church property in order to come into compliance with town requirements. (A many thanks to Pastor Harris who did most of this work & Mauro Alverez for several days on the excavator.)
- Purchase and installation of a keyless security system
- Purchase and installation of new storage shed

Sincere thanks, on behalf of all the deacons, to the many GBC members and attendees who helped get all this work done. There are too many to list here – we praise God for every one of you.

Missions Report - 2018

Those interested in Missionaries and Missions in general are invited to meet with us on the second Sunday evening of each month for updates about our missionaries and to pray for them. This includes both those we financially support and those who are friends of Grace Bible Church.

Morris Kushmar kept our Missions bulletin boards up to date. Missionary letters are posted around the World Map in the back of the church. The prayer cards for our missionaries are located under the map. Missionary letters received by email are forwarded to all those who would like them. David Harris kept the congregation informed about missions and missionaries, both supported and friends, by through regular *Missions Moments* updates in our regular worship services.

Our VBS Missions project collected \$292.58 for Slavic Gospel Associations "Immanuel's Child" program to provide materials for children in Russian.

There were two missions trips to the Dominican Republic in 2018. Winston Bernal & Pastor Harris were there April 30 - May 7 conducting church leadership conferences specifically promoting personal discipleship (See *Pastor's Report*). The Bernal family along with Andrea & Hannah Phelan were there August 3-12 working with the Compassion Center in Cienfuegos, children in two other churches and visiting the burn unit in a local hospital. Several large shipping boxes full of clothing, toys and school supplies were also sent. This is an expanding field. If you would be interested in going in 2019, please contact Winston or Jandry Bernal.

The following missionaries were with us in 2018:

- *Ryan Perry and his family were with us February 11. They serve with *Biblical Ministries Worldwide* and are targeting areas in Ontario, Canada for church planting.
- *Aleksandr Zarkarov & Victor Saharchuk were with us June 24. Both serve with Russian Christian Radio, a ministry we financially support.
- *Gary & Carole Allen (Christar Turkey) were with us July 22. They have retired a couple of times, but keep finding ways to be involved in missions. They currently spend several months a year in Istanbul helping with street evangelism and local churches.
- *Tom Stiles (Arise! Ministries) was with us August 19. He has been with us many times in the past. He wears many different ministry hats including encouraging churches as an itinerant preacher.

David Leak (*The Master's Harvest*) continued his evangelism ministry at Fairs & Festivals throughout the Northeast in 2017. He was with us again for the Ulster County Fair in August. You can get on Dave's email list for updates or arrange to help in 2019 by contacting him at david.a.leak@gmail.com. We have offered to support Dave as our New Missionary, but he preferred that other missionaries receive the support.

With funds still available in the new missionary line item, we were able to send half of it to help **Steven Savas** as a Missions Project Worker when he took a teaching job in Iraq working among the Kurdish people.

He has only been there one semester, but has already become in involved in a local international church, making efforts to evangelize and planning to begin discipling young Christians in 2019.

We are proposing to add **John & Monica Zheng** (GMI, Singapore) in 2019 as one of our supported missionaries with the funds that became available after Mike Coyle passed away. We have been wanting to add them since 2015. They were with us again in 2017. John has done an incredible job in helping to establish a training center in Singapore for Chinese speaking pastors throughout Asia. They are far ahead of their original goals, but increased oppression in China is making their work more difficult and dangerous for the pastors they are training. This also heightens the importance of their work. Copies of his Application are on the back table. We will be voting on his support at the Annual Business Meeting January 27, 2019

We are dropping *Care Net Pregnancy Center of the Hudson Valley* from support and moving the funds back to *LifeSavers Ministry* from which that support was taken in 2001. In brief, it has come to the attention of our Missions Committee and Pastor's Advisory Council that the organization no longer meets the criteria of our Missions Policy and is therefore not eligible to receive funding from our Missions Budget. (If you would like to know the details of this, you can talk with Pastor Harris or attend a meeting of either the Missions Committee or PAC). While the organization itself is not eligible, we do still encourage individual participation with the organization and especially as counselors since they are the only ones that may share the gospel with the women that come in for counseling. We will also still allow activities of the organization such as the Annual Banquet and the Walk for Life to be promoted at Grace Bible Church since it is still a noble work to seek to persuade women to allow their baby to live instead of being killed in an abortion. However, such promotion will be because it is a social service organization with a noble cause and in which Christian counselors can develop a ministry in sharing the gospel and not because it is a Christian Mission per se.

Men's Discipleship Report - 2018

In Matthew 28:19-20, Jesus gives the Great Commission - "Go therefore and make disciples of all the nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and the Son and the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I commanded you; and Io, I am with you always, even to the end of the age." The command is to make disciples and it is accomplished in three stages: 1) Going - Evangelism, which is proclaiming the gospel. 2) Baptizing - Identification, which is bringing a growing belief about Jesus into a public profession of faith. 3) Teaching them to observe His commandments - Practical spiritual growth, which is helping a Christian know, understand and walk properly with the Lord.

Discipleship is a core ministry at Grace Bible Church which occurs on many levels and is focused on the third aspect of the Great Commission. Our "teaching" ministry occurs in large groups such as Sunday Morning Worship, small groups such as our Bible Studies, and individually both formally and informally. Most individual discipleship occurs informally as Christians talk, pray and fellowship with each other, but we also have a formal One-to-One Discipleship program which is designed to accelerate Christian growth and train Christians to replicate themselves in others. There are approximately 55 adult males that currently attend GBC on a regular basis; 13 of them have completed the one to one discipleship (24%) and another 7 are currently in process of completing the material.

In addition to the One-to-One discipleship, three other opportunities for discipleship and fellowship were started during 2018.

- Monthly Men's Fellowship meets on the 2nd Sunday of the Month
- Saturday Morning Men's Group meets on the 2nd and 4th Saturday of the month. Currently using "Tender Warrior" by Stu Weber.
- Monday Evening Men's Group met every Monday and completed "A Man After God's Own Heart" by Jim George. Will resume with new book in 2019.

Please Note: The GBC purpose statement is "Glorifying God by Making Disciples of Jesus Christ." That is also the quest of our involvement in missions. We are very glad that GBC had the opportunity to bring this emphasis to two church fellowships in the Dominican Republic this past May – May the Lord continue to expand the ability of His people to disciple new believers into maturity and replication in a effective and efficient manner. - SLH

2018 Women's Discipleship Report

in 2018 we continued to promote discipleship among the women. Five more women completed basic discipleship and we currently have fourteen in progress. Many women at church have gone through this great growing experience. With so many new people and those moving away, there are many people discipling and serving the Lord in churches all over the country!

For those unfamiliar with discipleship, it is neither a program nor a class. It is a relationship formed between a more mature Christian and a younger Christian to cause growth to them both. Our favorite tool to use is the "One-to-One Discipleship" workbook which has 11 lessons on basic teachings on Christian belief and life. These lessons use Scripture to explain spiritual maturity, but spiritual growth is not merely head knowledge, but heart knowledge as well. The material also has assignments that develop Christian lifestyle habits such as Bible reading, prayer and taking notes on sermons. The discipler helps the disciple understand and put into practice living for Christ in the various situations of life. Biblical principles and commands address every question that could come up. The pattern was set by Christ as He discipled 12 men, who later spread the gospel throughout the world. It is a pleasure to see women grow. I am motivated by 2 Timothy 2:2 where Paul says: "These things, which you have heard from me, these entrust to faithful men who will be able to teach others also." This is the heart of discipleship, passing on the torch by spreading the Good News to all who will receive it and helping them walk with our Lord.

Last year, we completed the process of contracting with Multiplication Ministries to translate their English version of *One On One Discipleship* into Spanish for our growing Spanish Ministry at GBC. We are excited about being able to offer this solid material to our Spanish speaking disciples! (This material was also made available to the churches in the Dominican Republic)

Evangelism Report 2018

2018 was another busy year for us, praise God! Many people helped out over the course of the year, including those who witnessed on their own with friends, family, co-workers, strangers and at various locations.

Once again we were able to evangelize at many different locations and events such as, but not limited to, the streets of city of Poughkeepsie, Beacon, Wappingers Falls, Fishkill, New Paltz, the Walkway Over the Hudson, the Ulster County Fair, East Fishkill Day, Wappinger Town Day, and 4th of July Parade in Hyde Park. We were able to pass out Gospel tracts, Bibles, dvds and share the Gospel with people one to one.

Our main areas of evangelizing weekly are the city of Poughkeepsie, Beacon and when weather permits, the Walkway over the Hudson. We hit these places 2 - 4 times a week. Many hurting and lost souls in the city that need prayer. The Walkway is a great tourist spot that keeps increasing each year with the amount of people that attend.

During the months of March and April, myself and Lance Nitahara conducted a Basic Evangelism course for about 10 people. And in May we hosted a special test screening of Ray Comfort's new film "The Fool" before its release later in the year.

We had many come out for the 4th of July parade in Hyde Park. The Nitahara's host this event at their house with food and fellowship. Many of us gathered there first and then hit the streets of the parade. Almost 2,000 tracts were handed out!

Our big event of the year is the evangelism booth at the Ulster County Fair in August, which lasts 6 days. We went back to the "ARE YOU A GOOD PERSON" booth, and many people came out to help once again! Brother Dave Leak came down again this year from New Hampshire with two of his daughters to help every day. The Gospel was shared one to one with almost 600 hundred people!

In September we once again operated evangelism booths at both the East Fishkill and Wappinger Town Days. We were able to share the gospel one to one and hand out tracts with many people.

We will continue our efforts in 2019 to spread the Gospel to this lost and dying world. We will continue going to many of our regular locations and desire to spend more time at local colleges, Planned Parenthood, more local streets, public venues, trips to NYC, teaching more evangelism courses and helping Dave Leak with his evangelism ministry at fairs throughout the North East.

Please keep us in prayer for more laborers & more opportunities to share the Gospel, boldness & utterance of speech and to fulfill Colossians 4:2-6. Thank you everyone who has come out to help us and to those that prayed for us. We need your prayers! Thank you Saints!

Spanish Ministry Report

The mission team visited the burned unit at the regional children hospital. Distributed tracts to the hospital personal and patient's mother.

An Electrical generator purchased by 2 families from GBC was donated to the Yassica Church. All clothing and all the items donated by GBC members were distributed to the different places we visited.

2018 Website / Social Media Report

Our various access points to the Internet involve several people keeping them up. I do most of the posting on the GraceBibleNY.Org site with Jim Phelan adding the MP3 files to that site and to Sermon Audio. Jim is also our webmaster keeping up the technical aspects. Christine Bidetti, Danielle Harris and David Harris have all done work revising older web pages to make them more useable. Christine Bidetti has also been labeling / tagging our Youtube page along with Brad Whitney. Dominic Bonasio does most of the work with the facebook page. Jonathan Harris has been doing church promotions on facebook. Phil Jordan, with the help of several others, run the video streaming to the YouTube page of sermons, seminars, and pastor's classes.

The amount of traffic on the webpage is astounding.

The number of visitors increased from 437,589 to 581,411 (32.9%) and page visits increased 37.5% to 1,179.914. We had visits from people in 228 different countries. (See below for top 10 countries). It is very encouraging to find many visits from Islamic and Communist nations that have severe religious oppression (2,137 visits from Saudi Arabia alone). The Welcome page is the most viewed followed by the Church Constitution and then many sermons with 174 pages having more than 1,000 views (see below). I do not have webpage statistics on mp3 audio or powerpoint downloads. Both are downloaded directly from the pages since I was being overwhelmed by requests for the powerpoint files.

SermonAudio statistics are not as dramatic. Page views were up by 534% to 19,967 and video downloads increased to 59, but mp3 downloads decreased 15.2% to 2,819 for the year. We found we webcasting to be difficult do to restrictions on music with sermon audio. To post we need help from someone who will edit the video recordings and post just the sermon. See Pastor Harris or Phil Jordan if you would like to do this for us.

This is the first year statistics for facebook has been compiled, but looking over the changes month to month, there was a significant increase in interaction since advertising on facebook began in October. The statistics are below.

This is also the first year any statistics were complied for Youtube. Video streaming on Youtube is a mixed blessing. We have more people seeing the service (53 subscribers in 2018 on Youtube), but there has been a corresponding drop in church attendance. 2018 totals: 121 likes, 85 shares, 3,968 views totaling 808.1 hours. The greatest amount of watch times were for Kenny Steier's funeral (50.7 hrs), the sermon related to it (*When Tragedy Strikes* - 30.7 hrs), the Lowery wedding (20.1 hrs), *Loving Your Neighbor* (16.35 hrs) & A Sheep or Goat? (16.3 hrs).

Sermon Notes, which are the written notes of my sermons, are sent out to 1061individual email addresses each week which is a 55% increase from last year. I have started shifting the email list to MailChimp for processing because it became too difficult to use our current system. It was taking over 8 hours to send all the email batches out.

The ministry of Grace Bible Church via internet has become very significant in reaching people far beyond our geographical limitations. We praise the Lord for the ability to teach others and encourage them in walking with Christ locally, nationally, and internationally. All praise and glory be to our merciful and gracious God!

Kids4Truth Annual Report 2018

Starting in October of 2018, GBC continued with Kids4Truth Clubs for our children's ministry for grades pre-K to 8th grade. We started off with about 34 kids and 13 volunteer eager to share God's Truth with the children.

Kids4Truth Clubs is a "systematic theology for kids that teaches Bible doctrine." It helps to fulfill the mission of glorifying "God by providing church educational resources that are true to God's Word and encourage maturity in Christ."

The goals of Kids4Truth are:

- 1-Effectively teach important truths about God to boys and girls through meaningful, motivational, and memorable learning experiences.
- 2-Define and refine the minimum standard of Christian knowledge that boys and girls ought to have in order to avoid confusion, discourage hypocrisy, and promote authentic faith.
- 3-Utilize a tried-and-true, effective method by which we fortify young hearts and minds with doctrine.
- 4-Motivate and equip local churches, families, and individuals to become effective communicators of Biblical truth to children. "We want boys and girls to know both what they believe and why they believe it."

Kids are separated into 4 grade levels. Pre-kindergarten to kindergarten, 1st & 2nd, 3rd & 4th, and 5th - 8th. We start off the evening at 6:30 PM with opening prayer and music. Then the preK-K and 1st -2nd grades are dismissed for games, snacks, counsel time and crafts. The two older grade levels, 3rd -4th and 5th -8th, stay upstairs for their counsel time and then are dismissed for their game time. All grade levels then separate to their respective class rooms for Scripture memorization and Bible lessons from their workbooks.

Kids4Truth is on Friday nights from 6:30pm to 8:30pm from October to May. Kids receive awards, patches, and prizes for Scripture memorization, completing weekly workbook lessons, attendance, etc. We believe Kids4Truth will help fulfill GBC's mission statement of "Glorifying God by Making Disciples Of The Lord Jesus Christ." The Lord is gracious. Though total General Fund giving was 12.22% below budget, we spent 9.4%) below budgeted expenses which kept our net General Fund loss to \$13,833.05. We had plenty of reserves to remain in solid financial health.

Regular Giving

Total regular giving was \$197,218.34 which is \$27,457.54 (12.22%) below budgeted giving. Giving varied from week to week from a low of \$1,245 (1/14) to a high of \$7,458.70 (12/23). The first quarter was 16.5% under budget, the second quarter 15.1% under budget, the third quarter 11.4% below budget, and the fourth quarter 6.3% below budget.

General Expenses

General Expenses were below budget by \$2,774.34 (5.5%). Most line items were at or below budget, but several line items were above budget including utilities, property levy and insurance. Music and worship exceeded budget due to unanticipated replacement of equipment.

Local Missions

Local Missions was under budget by 34.3% (\$6,098.06). Discipleship materials overspent significantly due to growth in this ministry and taking advantage of a ½ price sale on discipleship books. Website expenses were 23% over budget due to unanticipated domain name renewal costs.

Missionaries & Missions Organizations

Missionaries and Mission Organizations were at or near budget in all categories. Half the funds available for New Missionary was sent to support Steven Savas who went to Iraq in August.

Staff Compensation

The Pastor's health plan remains flat due to being with Christian Healthshare Ministries. The Ministry Assistant was not able to take full advantage of the hours offered to him. Dominic Bonasio completed a full year of ministry.

Capital Fund

This fund began the year at \$63,214.45 and ended with \$38,169.01 with an income of \$15,322.27 and expenses of \$40,367.71. See the Funds Statement report for listing of how the funds were spent.

Designated Funds

The generosity of people above and beyond regular giving resulted in an additional income of \$4,730.25 for benevolence, missions and project funds. \$7,421.00 was expended with a total of \$10,315.35 remaining as designated for future use. (See Funds & Accounts Report for details).

2018 Budget Proposal Notes

Overview:

The proposed regular budget for 2018 is \$ 214,072 This is a spending decrease of \$ 10,604 (4.72%) from the 2018 budget. The giving amount needed to meet budget will be \$ 4,116.77 per week or \$ 17,839.33 per month. Projections for regular income in 2018 is between \$207,000 and \$212,000. The \$38,571.18 balance in the General Fund can cover any shortfall in anticipated giving vs. planned expenditures.

Most line items were kept at the 2018 levels. Some were either raised or lowered slight based on anticipated spending. We were able to reduce a few line items significantly. Line item explanations follow:

General Expenses

Nearly all of our costs for utilities increased as did our insurance.

Capital Fund: Sent to designated fund to cover costs of major repairs, replacement and capital projects Fellowship Activities: Expenses for Church Picnic, Annual Harvest Dinner and all church fellowships.

Kitchen: Plates, cups, utensils, coffee, etc. Costs overlap greatly with Fellowship Activities

Leadership Training: Registration costs for church leaders to attend conferences and leadership materials Maintenance: Reflects cost for maintaining property and facilities. Includes cleaning, repairs and supplies Music & Worship: Copyright licenses, music, equipment repair & replacement, bulletins and communion Office Expense: Supplies and postage

Security: Costs for training, yearly qualification and equipment

Outreach/Missions Expenses

Advertising: We dropped our yellow page adds. We re looking into other forms of advertising. Christian Education: Materials for Sunday School & Children's Church. SS attendance is now very small. Kids4Truth. Donations & fees for of those using this ministry keep the ministry costs down for the church. Local Outreach: Special Events - Costs of community outreaches - town days, fairs, etc. Our major expense is the Ulster County Fair outreach.

Tracts & Gospel Literature: Having a large stock of tracts on hand, we could lower this for 2019 *VBS*. Donations kept the costs to a minimum in 2018.

Visiting Ministries. Set to reflect anticipated costs of honorariums and travel expenses for guest speakers Website: Cost of ISP service, web site hosting and Sermon Audio fees

Missionaries & Missions Organizations:

Total amounts in these categories are being kept at the 2018 level.

Compensation

Ministry / Office Assistant line item was eliminated. David Harris, who is a licensed minister, said that he does not want to be paid for any work he does for the church in 2019

The Deacons increased the salary amounts for the *Minister of Evangelism and Assimilation* and *Senior Pastor* by $\sim 2\%$.

The Senior Pastor's *Medical* package was reduced was reduced by 34.3% (\$6,588) due to the ability of Diane Harris to find discounts and work with *Christian Healthcare Ministries* to keep medical expenses reimbursed by the church to a minimum. There is also a reserve in the HRA fund of \$32,499.99 to cover any unanticipated costs. (The HRA account accumulates from year to year, but remains with the church when the individual's employment ceases). We have been able to keep the medical line item the same or lowered over the last 7 years. This is the most significant decrease.

Projects to be done in future

- 1) Construction of a 24' X 30' Garage. This will include areas partitioned off for church storage. The metal garage is \$12,650. There will also have to be a concrete pad poured and the interior designed and built. Total estimate is between \$16,000 \$18,000
- 2) Furnace: It was recommended by our serviceman in 2016 to start considering a replacement of the church furnace. We will seek to keep it going as long as possible. (We have already used the smaller furnace more than 20 years since it was marked to be replaced within a few years).
- 3) Parsonage Roof will have to be replaced in the future. The last inspection in 2016 estimated it will last 4-5 more years. (2020-2021)
- 4) Electronic Sign: Designed to fit within the existing sign or similar size. We would like to have something similar to the New Hackensak Fire Department. Initial research indicates costs will be in the \$8-16,000 range. This cannot be done until all site plan work is completed.
- 5) Copier. The church copier is beginning to show its age and may need to be replaced within the next year or two.
- 6) Font Church Expansion: Expand building 21' adding 30 seats, doubling office space and adding a large foyer. Replace porch (6' wide) and add 24' Portico extension. This is approved within the site plan, but would require architecture drawings. No projected date for start.

Church Leader Affirmation
