- **4**. The Temptation & Introduction to Jesus' ministry; Call of Peter, Andrew, James & John.

- 5:1-11.... The Beatitudes qualities of the true Kingdom citizen and their resulting blessings.
- **5:17-20...** "I did not come to abolish, but to fulfill." Christ's confirmation of the Law by His perfect life & His teaching. Righteousness is more than Pharisaical keeping of the letter of the Law.
- 5:31-32... Unrighteous divorce and remarriage perpetuates adultery.
- **6:9-15...** The "Lord's Prayer"
- 7:15-23... Beware of False Teachers
- **8-9**. Miracles of Jesus
- 9:1-6.... The Messiah's authority to forgive sins. (cf. Ps. 103:2-3, Isa. 33:24).
- 10. The Twelve sent out to preach.
- 11:7-14... John the Baptist is emblematic of the coming of Elijah in the last days (Mal. 4:5,6).
- 12..... Jesus is Lord of the Sabbath Healing of Man with withered hand; Blasphemy against the Holy Spirit by Pharisees; sign of Jonah; "Who are my Mother and Brothers?"
- 12:22-32. The Pharisees commit the unforgivable sin of Blasphemy against the Holy Spirit by attributing Christ's power to heal to Beelzebul, the ruler of demons.

- 13. Parables of the Kingdom
 - Sower. Only seed on good ground will produce genuine Christians.
 - Wheat & Tares. False Religion will not be uprooted until judgment day.
 - Mustard Seed. Rapid growth & widespread influence of kingdom in this age.
 - <u>Leaven and Meal</u>. Leaven good or bad. Either this age ends in apostasy or Christianity becomes a world wide faith through the power of the Gospel
 - <u>Hidden Treasure/Pearl of Great Price</u>. Treasure /Pearl is Christians redeemed and the buyer is Christ or treasure/pearl is the Gospel and the buyer is the perspective Christian who is willing to give all for it.
 - <u>Dragnet</u>. Purging & separating judgment of real and false believers at the end of the age.
 - <u>Householder</u>. "New Things" are mysteries of the new age at hand. The Scribes are called upon to become disciples of the kingdom.
- 15:24. . . . Israel had priority in hearing the gospel of the Kingdom in keeping with God's plan for them to be a light to the nations.
- **16:18**. . . . ¹The rock is Peter's confession "You are the Christ," though he would be given special authority in the Kingdom as apostle and spokesman, but not as first pope. / ²Peter is the "rock," but this does not signify a succession of authority.
- 17:20. . . . Littleness of faith vs. faith of a mustard seed which could move a mountain.
- 18. Woes to Stumbling Blocks; Church Discipline; Unforgiving Slave.
- 18:3-5... Sons of the kingdom are to be as humble as children. Welcoming anyone who belongs to Christ is like welcoming Christ Himself.
- 18:15-20.. Church discipline
- **18:21-35**.. Forgiveness
- **19:4-9**... Jesus on divorce.
- **21:1-11...** Triumphal entry
- 23..... 7 (or 8) Woes to the Scribes and Pharisees.
- **24-25**. . . . Olivet Discourse.
- 24:36-42.. Christians do not know the exact time of Christ's return, but they can know the signs of that time, and thus should be prepared.
- 25:31-46.. The Sheep and Goat judgment. Reality of Heaven and Hell.
- **26**. The Last Supper, Jesus praying in the Garden of Gethsemane; Judas' betrayal, Jesus' arrest and trial before Caiaphas
- 27. Jesus' trial. Crucifixion and burial
- 27:57-66.. Secure burial, sealing and guarding of Tomb of Jesus. These details destroy the swoon and stolen body theories.
- **28...** Events of the Resurrection. The Great Commission (16-20)


