(A.D. 60's)

Author: Mark.

- *He is also referred to as John Mark (Acts 12:12) and was the cousin of Barnabas (Colossians 4:10). His mother had a large house in Jerusalem in which the church met (Acts 12). Peter may have been the one that led him to the Lord (cf. 1 Peter 5:13 he calls him "my son"). He went with Paul and Barnabas on their first missionary journey, but left early (Acts 13:5,13). This was the source of a later division between Paul & Barnabas (Acts 15), but later still, Mark was useful again to Paul (2 Timothy 4:11).
- * The early church uniformly affirms Mark as the author (Papias, Irenaeus, Clement of Alexandria, etc). Peter is Mark's primary source of information and authority.

Theme: Jesus, the Son of God as a Servant.

Purpose: Pastoral - The nature of being a disciple of Jesus.

Misc. It is the briefest of the Four Gospels.

Mark wrote to a Gentile (Roman) audience, so he omits material unimportant to Gentiles (such as Jesus' genealogy, fulfilled prophecy, and references to law and Jewish customs as found in the other gospels, while explaining things unfamiliar to a Roman audience including the meaning of certain words or even using Latin equivalents (4:21; 6:27; 12:14,42; 15:15-16, 39). A theme of Jesus as the victor in conflict can also be traced through Mark - a theme to which Roman Gentiles would pay attention and especially in the contrast Jesus' ability to gain victory contrasted with Roman emphasis on power. The other Gospels are <u>not</u> dependent on Mark

LUKE

Author: Luke

The introduction in Acts shows that the author of that book is also the author of this gospel account. Both are written to a Greek man named Theophilus. Church tradition (including: Muratorian Fragment, Irenaeus, Tertullian, Clement of Alexandria, Origen, Eusebius & Jerome) strongly support Luke as the author both books. In a process of elimination of those fitting the description in the "we" passages of Acts and those listed in the third person in the book, the only two possibilities are Titus and Luke, and Luke fits the best. Luke may have been a Gentile (cf. Col. 4:10-14).

Theme: Jesus as the Son of Man.

Luke presents an historical, chronological account of Jesus as the perfect man who came to seek and save sinful men. (Key verse: 19:10 *"For the Son of Man has come to seek and to save that which was lost.")*

Misc.

Luke places a stress that Christ is also Savior of the Gentiles. He is writing to a Greek man (Theophilus) engaging in a Greek way of thinking by providing a history of Jesus based on research of eyewitness accounts.

Luke was a companion of Paul and wrote based on his authority.
