(late 80's)

Author: John, the Apostle

The author must be a Palestinian Jew who was an eye witness of the events recorded. John 21:24 & 21:20 demand that he is one of the Twelve. A careful study of the other disciples eliminate them as the writer and so leave John as the "one whom Jesus loved." Eusebius, Origen, Clement of Alexandria, Tertullian, Ireneus (who was the disciple of Polycarp, a disciple of John) and Papias, who was a direct disciple of John, all agree that the apostle John wrote the Gospel account given his name.

John & his brother James, were sons of Zebedee and Salome (Mark 1:19; 16:1 cf. Mt. 27:56). Zebedee seems to have been a prosperous fisherman in Galilee (either Bethsaida or Capernaum). Salome is the sister of Mary, Jesus' mother, so John and James are cousins of Jesus. John had been a disciple of John the baptist, and then followed Jesus and became one of Jesus' inner circle (Peter, James & John) present at the Transfiguration and the Garden of Gethsemane. He may have been present at Jesus' trial (John 18:15) and was present at the crucifixion where Jesus entrusted the care of His mother to him (John 19:26,27).

John is in Jerusalem for many years as one of the "pillars of the church" (Gal. 2:9; Acts 15:6). He left Jerusalem before the Jewish War and possibly as early as A.D. 59. There is indication that he was in Asia Minor by at least A.D. 69 where he was instrumental in the conversion and discipleship of Polycarp. John lived in Ephesus for several years, and then sometime during the reign of Domitia (A.D. 81-96) he was banished to the island of Patmos, about 75 miles southwest of Ephesus. He received and wrote Revelation during that period. He returned to Ephesus during the reign of Nerva (A.D. 96-98) and died in Ephesus at the beginning of Trajan's reign (c. A.D. 98). His close relationship to the Ephesian church is seen in his three Epistles, especially 2 & 3 John which were written to individuals Ephesus.

- **Date**: Tradition holds that John wrote his gospel from Ephesus, which would place the writing either before or after his exile to Patmos. This would mean that it could be as early as A.D. 80 and as late as A.D. 98.
- **Theme**: Jesus as the Son of God. Written to all men that "you may believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God; and that believing you may have life in His name." (John 20:31).
- **Misc**. John's purpose is stated directly in John 20:31 (above). The focus is on the person of Jesus Christ Himself with special emphasis on His deity.

In writing his gospel account he also supplements the synoptic accounts with more detail, especially about Jesus' early ministry and the events just prior to the crucifixion. He also corrects the gnostic error of Cerinthus that denied the deity of Jesus.

John is much more exact than the Synoptics indicating the timing and place of events. This has allowed us to determine the length of Christ's ministry.

The teaching of Christ dominates the Gospel of John, but the teaching is not given in parables, but rather it is in elaborate discourses which was Jesus' method in His early ministry and the appropriate form when privately teaching His disciples.
