# New Testament Survey <u>COLOSSIANS</u>

Author: Paul (1:1,23; 4:18)

**Date**: 61

Theme: Pre-eminence & Sufficiency of Christ. A right view of Christ corrects heresy.

**Misc**. Colossae was a small city about 100 miles east of Ephesus in the fertile Lycus Valley. The church had been founded by Epaphras (1:4-8; 2:1) and not Paul (who does not appear to have visited it). Paul writes to refute a threatening heresy that presented a diminished view of Jesus Christ. This letter and Ephesians were carried by Tychicus (Ephesians 6:21; Col. 4:7).

## New Testament Survey PHILEMON

Author: Paul (verses 1, 9, 19)

Date: A.D. 61

- **Theme**: Bondage to Brotherhood in Christ. Paul's tactful letter to Philemon asking him to forgive and accept his runaway slave Onesimus.
- **Misc**. <u>Philemon</u> is a Christian slave owner who had previously benefitted from Paul's ministry. <u>Onesimus</u> is a slave who receives Christ under Paul's ministry in Rome and must now return to his master. Paul writes this letter and sends it with Onesimus who is accompanying Tychicus back to Colossae (Colossians 4:7-9).
