#### Rule One: Work from the assumption that the Bible is authoritative (Pages 147-152)

Competing Sources of Authority

Tradition

Reason / Rationalism

The Bible is the final court of appeal

Authority has to do with the will, with obedience, and with doing

Inspiration concerns the intellect, understanding, and knowledge

#### **Expressions of Biblical Authority**

- 1. A person acts in an authoritative manner, and the passage explains whether the act is approved or disapproved. *Either immediate context or further revelation about it. Examples: Satan's lies; Nathan's initial approval corrected by God that night; The Jerusalem Council being cited by Paul in rebuking Peter*
- 2. A person acts in an authoritative manner and the passage does not indicate approval or disapproval.
- 3. God or one of His representatives states the mind and will of God
