Church Officer Qualifications - Deacons

Deacon means "table waiter." They are servants of the church. Deacons were charged by the Apostles to help with the temporal affairs of the church (Acts 6:1-6). In practical terms they assist the Elders as directed. They must meet certain spiritual qualifications.

Acts 6:3 "But select from among you, brethren, seven men of good reputation, full of the Spirit and of wisdom, whom we may put in charge of this task."

1 Timothy 3:8-10,12-13 ⁸"Deacons likewise must be men of dignity, not double-tongued, or addicted to much wine or fond of sordid gain, ⁹but holding to the mystery of the faith with a clear conscience. ¹⁰And let these also first be tested; then let them serve as deacons if they are beyond reproach. ¹²Let deacons be husbands of one wife, and good managers of their children and their own households. ¹³For those who have served well as deacons obtain for themselves a high standing and great confidence in the faith that is in Christ Jesus."

Deacons are to be:

1. MEN OF DIGNITY - v.8

A deacon is to be a grave, serious minded, steady, solid individual. He behaves in an honorable manner.

2. NOT DOUBLE-TONGUED - v.8

A deacon does not say one thing to one person and something else to another. He is not malicious gossips. They are consistent and righteous in what they say.

3. NOT ADDICTED TO MUCH WINE - v.8

A deacon does not abuse alcohol (or any drug). He is noted for his sobriety.

4. NOT FOND OF SORDID GAIN - v.8

A deacon does not in love with material wealth. His goals in life are not monetary.

5. HOLDING TO THE MYSTERY OF THE FAITH WITH A CLEAR CONSCIENCE - v.9

A deacon has solid convictions based on an understanding of Biblical doctrine. His conscience is clear because he lives according to those convictions.

6. LET THESE ALSO FIRST BE TESTED; THEN LET THEM SERVE AS DEACONS - v.10

A deacon is not a new believer, but one who has been tested and has proven himself to be faithful in serving. In a real sense a man must do the work of a deacon before being recognized as a deacon.

7. IF THEY ARE BEYOND REPROACH - v.10

A deacon's life is beyond reproach. He lives in such away that he will not be accused of wrong-doing, and if accused there will be no evidence to support the accusation.

8. LET DEACONS BE HUSBANDS OF ONE WIFE - v.12

A deacon is a one woman man. He is completely devoted to only one woman - his wife. If he is single, he does not "play the field," but explores one relationship at a time.

9. GOOD MANAGERS OF THEIR CHILDREN AND THEIR OWN HOUSEHOLDS - v.12

A deacon must demonstrate his ability to manage his children and household. He makes provision for those over whom he has responsibility and leads them righteously. He keeps the family in order though application of Biblically principles.

Deacons

Table waiting

Jn 2:5,9 - Wedding at Cana. "said unto the <u>servants</u>.... but the <u>servants</u> knew..." Luke 4:39 - Peter's mother after she was healed. "she arose and <u>ministered</u> unto them..." John 12:2 - "There they made Him a supper; and Martha <u>served</u>" Luke 10:40 - "my sister has left me to <u>serve</u> alone."

General service

John 12:26 - general service to Christ. *"if any man <u>serve</u> Me... My <u>servant..."</u> Romans 13:3,4 - authorities are a "<u>minister</u> of God to thee." Luke 22:27 - general service given by Christ. <i>"I am among you as he that serveth"*

Spiritual Service

Romans 15:25 - Paul says, "Now I go unto Jerusalem to <u>minister</u> unto the saints."
Acts 20:19 - Paul says of himself, "<u>Serving</u> the Lord with all humilty of mind."
2 Cor 8:3,4 - Macedonian church supported Paul." "the fellowship of the <u>ministering</u> to the saints.
1 Cor 12:5 - a "variety of <u>ministries</u>, but the same Lord"
2 Cor 4:1 - Paul speaking, "seeing we have this <u>ministry</u> ..." (Preaching Christ).
2 Cor 9:1 - Giving financially. touching the <u>ministring</u> unto the saints

Notes on the "Deaconate" in Acts

Acts 6

- A) Vs 1,2 Apostles saw that it was "not desirable for us to neglect the word of God in order to serve tables" (diakonia).
- B) Vs 3 Apostles ask congregation to choose men who have certain characteristics "whom we may put in charge of this task." Note the word "deacon" (diakonos) is not used, but instead serving tables (diakonia) in verse 2 is referred to here as being a task not an office)
- B) Vs 4 Apostles will devote themselves to prayer and the ministry (diakonia) of the word.
- C) Vs 5,6 the seven are chosen and then brought to the Apostles who ordained (laid hands on) them.
- D) The New Testament never refers to the men listed here as deacons. Only Stephen and Philip are mentioned again. The only title given Philip is that he is called "the evangelist" in Acts 21:8. Stephen is preaching in Acts 7 which is performing a function more in keeping with an elder rather than deacon (see 1 Tim. 3), and in addition, he is not carrying out the duties given to him in Acts 6.
- E) Note in Acts 6:5 that all those chosen have Greek names. If an office of deacon was being established its seems very strange that in Jerusalem there were no non-Hellenistic Jews that would have been chosen. The men seem to have been chosen to carry out a specific task to the Hellenistic widows.

Acts 11:29-30

Note that deacons are not mentioned in this passage even though the relief food sent to help would have fit the function of the seven in Acts 6. Instead the relief supplies were sent in charge of Barnabas and Saul to the elders.

Acts 15

Note that deacons are not mentioned anywhere in the text. The council of the Jerusalem church of Barnabas and Paul going to the apostles and elders (vs 2,6,22,23)

The Qualifications for Deacons

1 Timothy 3:8-10,12

The Work of Deacons

The qualifications in 1 Timothy 3 indicates mature men of God who serve as servants (vs 10) under the direction of the elders (overseers).

If Acts 6 does refer to an office of deacons - they served under the apostles as those that distributed food, etc. to the needy.

Conclusions

Deacons are servants that serve under the direction of overseers/elders. The New Testament gives no indication whatsoever that Deacons serve in a capacity of leaders who direct the church. That responsibility belongs to the overseers/elders.

- Matthew 20:26 But it shall not be so among you: but whosoever will be great among you, let him be your <u>minister</u>;
- Matthew 22:13 Then said the king to the <u>servants</u>, Bind him hand and foot, and take him away, and cast *him* into outer darkness; there shall be weeping and gnashing of teeth.
- Matthew 23:11 But he that is greatest among you shall be your servant.
- Mark 9:35 And he sat down, and called the twelve, and saith unto them, If any man desire to be first, *the same* shall be last of all, and <u>servant</u> of all.
- Mark 10:43 But so shall it not be among you: but whosoever will be great among you, shall be your minister:
- John 2:5 His mother saith unto the servants, Whatsoever he saith unto you, do it.

- Ephesians 6:21 But that ye also may know my affairs, *and* how I do, Tychicus, a beloved brother and faithful <u>minister</u> in the Lord, shall make known to you all things:
- Philippians 1:1 Paul and Timotheus, the servants of Jesus Christ, to all the saints in Christ Jesus which are at Philippi, with the bishops and <u>deacons</u>:
- Colossians 1:7 As ye also learned of Epaphras our dear fellow servant, who is for you a faithful <u>minister</u> of Christ;
- Colossians 1:23 If ye continue in the faith grounded and settled, and *be* not moved away from the hope of the gospel, which ye have heard, *and* which was preached to every creature which is under heaven; whereof I Paul am made a <u>minister</u>;
- Colossians 1:25 Whereof I am made a <u>minister</u>, according to the dispensation of God which is given to me for you, to fulfil the word of God;
- Colossians 4:7 All my state shall Tychicus declare unto you, *who is* a beloved brother, and a faithful <u>minister</u> and fellow servant in the Lord:
- 1 Thessalonians 3:2 And sent Timotheus, our brother, and <u>minister</u> of God, and our fellowlabourer in the gospel of Christ, to establish you, and to comfort you concerning your faith:

- Acts 1:17 For he was numbered with us, and had obtained part of this ministry.
- Acts 1:25 That he may take part of this <u>ministry</u> and apostleship, from which Judas by transgression fell, that he might go to his own place.
- Acts 6:1 And in those days, when the number of the disciples was multiplied, there arose a murmuring of the Grecians against the Hebrews, because their widows were neglected in the daily <u>ministration</u>.
- Acts 6:4 But we will give ourselves continually to prayer, and to the ministry of the word.
- Acts 11:29 Then the disciples, every man according to his ability, determined to send <u>relief</u> unto the brethren which dwelt in Judaea:
- Acts 12:25 And Barnabas and Saul returned from Jerusalem, when they had fulfilled *their* ministry, and took with them John, whose surname was Mark.

- 2 Corinthians 9:12,13 For the <u>administration</u> of this service not only supplieth the want of the saints, but is abundant also by many thanksgivings unto God; Whiles by the experiment of this <u>ministration</u> they glorify God for your professed subjection unto the gospel of Christ, and for *your* liberal distribution unto them, and unto all *men*;
- 2 Corinthians 11:8 I robbed other churches, taking wages of them, to do you service.

- Matthew 25:44 Then shall they also answer him, saying, Lord, when saw we thee an hungred, or athirst, or a stranger, or naked, or sick, or in prison, and did not <u>minister</u> unto thee?
- Matthew 27:55 And many women were there beholding afar off, which followed Jesus from Galilee, <u>ministering</u> unto him:
- Mark 1:13 And he was there in the wilderness forty days, tempted of Satan; and was with the wild beasts; and the angels <u>ministered</u> unto him.
- Mark 1:31 And he came and took her by the hand, and lifted her up; and immediately the fever left her, and she <u>ministered</u> unto them.
- Mark 10:45 For even the Son of man came not to be <u>ministered</u> unto, but to <u>minister</u>, and to give his life a ransom for many.
- Mark 15:41 (Who also, when he was in Galilee, followed him, and <u>ministered</u> unto him;) and many other women which came up with him unto Jerusalem.

- Acts 19:22 So he sent into Macedonia two of them that <u>ministered</u> unto him, Timotheus and Erastus; but he himself stayed in Asia for a season.
- Romans 15:25 But now I go unto Jerusalem to minister unto the saints.
- 2 Corinthians 3:3 *Forasmuch as ye are* manifestly declared to be the epistle of Christ <u>ministered</u> by us, written not with ink, but with the Spirit of the living God; not in tables of stone, but in fleshy tables of the heart.
- 2 Corinthians 8:19,20 And not *that* only, but who was also chosen of the churches to travel with us with this grace, which is <u>administered</u> by us to the glory of the same Lord, and *declaration of* your ready mind: Avoiding this, that no man should blame us in this abundance which is <u>administered</u> by us:
- 1 Tiznothy 3:10 And let these also first be proved; then <u>let</u> them <u>use the office of a deacon</u>, being *found* blameless.
- 1 Timothy 3:13 For they that <u>have used the office of a deacon</u> well purchase to themselves a good degree, and great boldness in the faith which is in Christ Jesus.
- 2 Timothy 1:18 The Lord grant unto him that he may find mercy of the Lord in that day: and in how many things he <u>ministered</u> unto me at Ephesus, thou knowest very well.
- Philemon 13 Whom I would have retained with me, that in thy stead he might have <u>ministered</u> unto me in the bonds of the gospel:
- Hebrews 6:10 For God *is* not unrighteous to forget your work and labour of love, which ye have shewed toward his name, in that ye <u>have ministered</u> to the saints, and <u>do minister</u>.
- 1 Peter 1:12 Unto whom it was revealed, that not unto themselves, but unto us they <u>did minister</u> the things, which are now reported unto you by them that have preached the gospel unto you with the Holy Ghost sent down from heaven; which things the angels desire to look into.
- 1 Peter 4:10,11 As every man hath received the gift, even so <u>minister</u> the same one to another, as good stewards of the manifold grace of God. If any man speak, let him speak as the oracles of God; if any man <u>minister</u>, let him do it as of the ability which God giveth: that God in all things may be glorified through Jesus Christ, to whom be praise and dominion for ever and ever.
